

# Revised MRP Mandatory?

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# Is affixing a revised MRP label compulsory?

There is a big question right now:

Is revised-MRP stickering compulsory after the GST rate cut?

It's a burning issue.



# **Our View is**

- It is not mandatory. The reason is that, under the Legal Metrology framework, the language used is "permitted/allowed," not "shall/compulsory."
- Further, to add legal support, there is a departmental clarification issued in the pharmaceuticals context; we can rely on that as a supporting base.



# **Quick Analysis**

### NPPA Office Memorandum (12.09.2025):

- Requires that the benefit of the GST rate reduction be passed on to consumers and that companies revise MRP w.e.f. 22.09.2025 through price lists and dealer communication.
- For stock already in the market, manufacturers/marketers who desire to re-label/resticker may do so in a phased manner to avoid shortages—this indicates permission, not compulsion.



### CDSCO communications (11.09.2025):

 Provide a "no-objection" to stickering of revised MRP (e.g., for specified classes of medical devices) and request State/UT Drug Controllers to expedite NOCs.

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 Again, the wording reflects that stickering is allowed/permitted, not mandated.

**Takeaway:** Passing on the price benefit is compulsory; physical re-labelling is an optional, permitted method for existing market stock.



# **Practical Checklists**

- 1. Update price lists (Form V/VI) and share promptly with the trade.
- 2. Communicate reduced prices to distributors/retailers (emails, notices, POS updates).
- 3. Update MRPs on all new production/shipments after 22-09-2025.
- 4. If opting to re-sticker existing stock, plan a phased exercise and finish within 3 months (per CDSCO no-objection).
- 5. Maintain records of price lists and communications as proof that the benefit was passed on.
